Welcome to the Annual Report of Teach For Lebanon (TFL)

Marking 15 years of dedication to providing quality education to Lebanon's children and fostering youth leadership and civic engagement.

As we reflect on the past academic year, we also take this moment to look back on our journey over the last decade and a half, and consider the path forward as we navigate an increasingly complex landscape.

The Crisis in Education

In 2008, Lebanon's education system was already strained, especially in rural and underserved areas. Since then, compounded crises—economic collapse, political instability, health emergencies, and now, the devastation of war—have widened educational gaps, leaving many students more than two years behind in their learning.

Sadly, we are now preparing for another academic year filled with uncertainty, marking the sixth consecutive year of major disruptions in education. The recent outbreak of war has further devastated Lebanon's educational infrastructure. In the war-ravaged South, the Bekaa, southern Beirut, and other deeply affected regions, children's lives and futures are being shattered, their hopes buried beneath the rubble.

The children we serve—many of whom have witnessed more devastation than any child should—deserve the chance to dream again, to build a future, and to lead their communities out of darkness.

Teach For Lebanon's Response and Impact

At TFL, we firmly believe that a strong society is built on the foundation of excellent education, and excellent education demands exceptional teachers. Over the past 15 years, TFL has met this challenge by training and inspiring over 225 alumni who now serve as leaders in schools, NGOs, and government institutions. These individuals form a collective force for change. Together, we hold the power to shape Lebanon's future, leading with

integrity, compassion, and a deep commitment to ensuring that every child, no matter their circumstances, has the opportunity to succeed.

With 100 Fellows actively engaged last year, and the same number expected this year, we continue to build momentum. Our Fellows and alumni embody our mission: they are behavior-shapers, mindset-shifters, and movement-builders, leading their communities toward positive and more optimistic outcomes for all children.

Addressing Unprecedented Challenges

This year, as countless families remain displaced and schools are converted into shelters, the challenges we face have multiplied. Even if the violence were to stop today, many families don't have homes and jobs to return too, and the damage to schools will take time to repair, leaving many of them unable to function for the foreseeable future.

Yet, we remain steadfast. We are equipping TFL, our Fellows, our team, and the teachers we work with to ensure that education endures, even in the darkest times. Over the years, we have become experts in delivering education in emergency contexts. Our trauma-informed teaching, social-emotional learning, and digital and call-based education programs enable our Fellows to continue teaching and inspiring, no matter the circumstances.

The Power of Education in Emergencies

Education is more than just learning—teachers provide sanctuary, offer safety, stability, and emotional support. We have witnessed firsthand the power of education in emergencies, and we remain committed to ensuring that every child, regardless of their circumstances, receives the education they deserve.

Our internal assessments consistently highlight the profound impact our Fellows have on their students. On average, 92% of our students feel supported by their Fellow teacher; 88% engage more actively in lessons; and, as a result, 92% show improved understanding of subjects.

Our Fellows foster critical skills like self-advocacy and problem-solving, teaching not just what to learn, but how to think and lead.

The Role of Partnerships

Our success is shared with our partners—Teach For Lebanon US, Teach For All, UNICEF, GiZ, IRC, and many others—whose steadfast support has been vital in reaching Lebanon's most vulnerable children. Programs like the Call and Learn Recovery Hotline, in partnership with UNICEF, are aiming to reach over 100,000 children affected by learning disruptions. The Access Program serves intensively 500 children over two years, providing them with vital life skills, alongside English learning classes and personal development opportunities.

Call for Support

Despite our increased reach and impact, the **ongoing war has deepened Lebanon's educational crisis.** Now, more than ever, we urgently need your support to meet the growing needs of affected children.

Every school closure, every displaced child, and every disrupted life underscores the increasing importance of TFL's mission. Thanks to your incredible generosity, we have raised \$2,328,652 to support our mission. We are proud to share that 84% of these funds were dedicated directly to our educational initiatives, ensuring that your support makes a lasting impact. The remaining 16% was used responsibly to cover essential operational costs, helping us continue our work effectively.

Driving Change in Education

We successfully managed our Fellowship program, empowering young leaders to become catalysts for change in underserved communities. Our partnerships with esteemed organizations like UNICEF, GiZ, IRC, and many more local and international partners significantly amplified our efforts. These collaborations provided crucial resources and expertise, enabling us to reach and positively influence the lives of countless students across Lebanon. Together, we created a more inclusive and supportive learning environment, ensuring that every child, regardless of their background, has access to quality education and the opportunity to thrive. The results of our Fellows' influence echo global efforts to enhance education, where 92% of our students feel supported by their Fellow teacher, 88% engage more in lessons, and 92% learn and understand subjects better than before.



Our Fellows

The Teach For Lebanon (TFL) Fellowship Program is the cornerstone of our organization's mission to transform education in Lebanon. The program focuses on two main objectives: improving learning outcomes for students in underprivileged communities and developing our Fellows into leaders capable of advocating for educational change.

The Fellowship program recruits, trains, and places young leaders in underprivileged schools to serve as teachers for two years. They make a positive impact on the community and the schools through the implementation of extracurricular activities (ECAs), to equip the children they teach with lifelong learning skills.

Once our Fellows complete their Fellowship after two years, they become part of the TFL alumni community, which continues to contribute to the education sector by assuming roles as teachers and in educational NGOs. To this day, more than 65% of our alumni remain committed to our shared vision of providing quality education to all children in Lebanon.







Teach For Lebanon is actively engaged in training 25 Fellows on various topics, with a focus on improving the academic performance of their students and nurturing their social and emotional well-being and practices.

TFL Fellows cascaded the Healing Classrooms training to a total of 359 non-TFL teachers through both online and in-person sessions. The training focused on promoting a sense of control, of belonging, and of pride, fostering positive social relationships and providing intellectual stimulation.

Through the series of training the Fellows received by IRC on Healing Classrooms, Positive Discipline, Social Emotional Learning, Child Protection, Universal Design Learning, Inquiry-based Learning, and Inclusive Teaching, the Fellows were able to support 2169 vulnerable students from grades 1 to 9.

5 TFL Alumni implemented community service projects in the South and Beqaa governorates. All the projects focused on supporting the psychological well-being of teachers, students and parents, and aimed at improving academic performance, promoting resilience and building healthier coping strategies.

Education in Emergencies (EIE)







TFL Hosts Teach For All's First Education in Emergencies (EiE) Immersion

Teach For Lebanon, in collaboration with Teach For All, convened a cohort of senior leadership team partners from nine organizations within the Teach For All network. The event was a unique opportunity to share knowledge and best practices, build new networks, foster collaboration across sectors and disciplines, and enable our organization to gain a deeper understanding of the opportunities for innovation and change in the "Education In Emergencies" context.

The five-day event took place in Byblos, Lebanon, from Saturday, April 28th, to Wednesday, May 3rd, 2023, and included network partners from Teach For Sweden, Teach For Ukraine, Teach For Armenia, Teach For Uganda, Teach For Mexico, Teach For Italy, Teach For Colombia, Teach For Ethiopia, and Teach For Bangladesh.

Together in the network, we stand strong to learn and develop solutions for displaced children.

Our Fellows: Fellowship Projects

Shabaké 2

To help students study new concepts interactively and reinforce concepts learned in school, TFL partnered with Lebanese Alternative Learning (LAL) on the Shabaké 2 project and trained 20 TFL Fellows on how to use LAL's Hybrid Learning Model (HLM). This training has been cascaded to 112 non-TFL teachers, who have introduced the Tabshoura application to their students from kindergarten to Grade 9.

The Shabaké 2 project is supported by Agence Française de Développement - AFD and the Centre de Crise et De Soutien and implemented by the French public agency for international technical cooperation Expertise France. Local partners are LAL and TFL.

Our Fellows: Fellowship Projects

Let Girls Thrive

"Let Girls Thrive" is a project under the Fellowship Program at Teach For Lebanon that addresses sociocultural biases and the economic crisis faced in Lebanon that hinders girls' ability to attend, remain in, and thrive in school across multiple contexts. The program includes both girls and boys in its efforts to overcome these barriers, creating a supportive educational environment for all. The project is funded by Teach For All, and is implemented across Lebanon.

Our Fellows: Fellow-Led Projects

Climate Education (Planet B)

Working on climate education is important for TFL, because it equips our students with the knowledge and skills to address the pressing challenges of climate change, ensuring a sustainable future for all. The program, initiated in September 2021, currently has 10 Fellows from Cohorts 14 and 15. The project is currently led by Cohort 14 Yasmina Noureddine who coordinates closely with TFL's Education Manager. The program is funded by the Climate Education Leadership fund provided by Teach For All.

Our Fellows: Fellow-Led Projects

Well-being Program

A Fellow who maintains their well-being and mental health can effectively support their students in the classroom. Given the demanding nature of the Fellowship, 8 Fellows from Cohorts 13 and 14 initiated the well-being program in December 2021 which is led today by 15 Fellows from Cohorts 14 and 15. This program employs a holistic, three-dimensional leadership approach led by Fellows, designated as "Well-being guides," who engage in well-being activities such as mindful conversations and yoga. These guides work closely with Teach For Lebanon's education team and under the supervision of TFL's Education Manager to organize and lead tailored initiatives supporting both Fellows and students.

Our Fellows: A Report from a Fellow in the South



Every day at Teach For Lebanon has been a journey of self-discovery, revealing parts of myself that I was unaware of. I am surprised at how I can control my emotions and provide my students with stability in the middle of the chaos around us in South Lebanon, even when the distant sound of bombings makes them panic. As we go through hardship together, day by day, I get to understand the extent of my resilience and the deep bond I have with my kids in these challenging moments.

The sound of bombings often breaks the calm in our classroom. Some students cry out in fear, while others try to hide their worry by laughing. Parents rush to pick up their children, adding to the stress of those who stay behind. But, in the middle of this chaos, I use all my strength to bring comfort and stability, listen to the students' fears, and reassure them because I am determined to create a safe space for them, even in the hardest times. As a Teach For Lebanon Fellow, I begin each day by getting ready and preparing myself for whatever challenges may arise. And as the day comes to an end and the chaos settles, I reflect on the difficulties we've encountered and our resilience. Even with the lingering fear, I take comfort in the fact that every day offers fresh chances for growth and connections. Managing our anxieties together is a sign of our community's resilience and a constant reminder that we are never alone in the face of difficulty.

Partner Programs













Call and Learn Recovery Hotline Program

Teach For Lebanon launched Call and Learn Recovery Hotline, a toll-free academic support service for students in Grades 1 through 9, covering subjects such as Mathematics, Arabic, Sciences, Civics, English, and French. This initiative began as a pilot project from August 2022 to September 2023, with funding from UNICEF.

Following a successful application to a public call, Teach For Lebanon secured a partnership with UNICEF in February 2024 to continue and expand the project. Initially starting with 12 teachers, the program has scaled up to reach 67 teachers and alumni to support the program goal of helping 100,000 students across Lebanon.

The English Access Microscholarship Program

The English Microscholarship Program (Access) is a two-year global scholarship program that provides a foundation of English language skills to economically disadvantaged students (ages 13-18) through after-school classes. The program features activities designed to enhance leadership skills and technology skills.

Since 2020, Teach For Lebanon (TFL) has proudly conducted the Access Program in Lebanon. In each Cohort are 500 students enrolled. Since the program's inception, we have seen a significant improvement in academic performance, with nearly doubling the number of students scoring over 70 out of 100. Today, an impressive 74% of students consistently achieve scores above 70. Building on this success, TFL is looking forward to conduct the Program for Cohort 17 (2023-2025) for the third consecutive 2-year cycle.





Summer Camp

In the context of the Intensive Sessions component of the English Access Microscholarship Program funded by the American people, Teach For Lebanon held its second Access Program Summer Camp in 2023, attended by 445 of its 500 students from all over Lebanon, and divided over four regional clusters. Over one year, Access 16 students designed and implemented several impressive social projects that addressed critical issues such as suicide prevention, breast cancer awareness, anti-bullying, anti-smoking campaigns, and environmental protection.



These initiatives not only raised awareness but also empowered participants to engage with these important topics, fostering a sense of community and positive change. The camps provided training on social entrepreneurship, team-building activities, and entertainment. The Access students presented their 75 community service projects to juries that included TFL's Secretary of the Board Ms. Maissa Abou Adal, donor's representative Ms. Edith Bitar, and her colleagues, as well as Access alumni and TFL staff.






